

Federal Mental Health, Drug and Alcohol Prevention, Treatment and Research Funding, FY 2008-2010

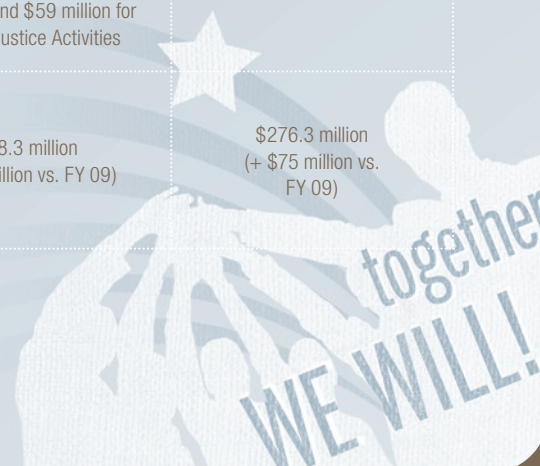
The National Council advocates for a range of discretionary programs within the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) that comprise the continuum of prevention, treatment, and recovery services for individuals and families affected by mental illness and substance use disorders. In addition, there are several critical programs within the Department of Justice that are designed to divert people from incarceration to community-based care and help people access mental health and addiction services upon their release from incarceration. These programs are critical to control healthcare and criminal justice costs, help millions of Americans live healthier lives, and strengthen individuals, families, communities and our nation. **We urge Congress to support the following funding recommendations.**
