Additional details about the proposal will be conveyed as information becomes available.

**As part of the FY 08 Budget request, the Administration requested that funding for a range of discretionary programs, including the Drug Court program and the Mentally Ill Offender Crime Treatment Reduction Act Program, be consolidated into a new Byrne Public Safety and Protection Program for funding purposes; Congress chose to instead continue funding each individually. The Administration proposal has been repeated in the FY 09 Budget Request.

*** The House Appropriations Committee's numbers from their markup of the Labor-Health and Human Services (HHS)-Education and Related Agencies spending bill have not yet been made public.
