The previous administration proposed an increase of \$20 million for the SAPT Block Grant to “support supplemental performance awards for the top 20 percent of grant recipients that demonstrate superior performance in preventing and treating substance abuse.” This requirement **was not included in the FY 09 Omnibus Bill.*

***As part of the FY 08 Budget request, the previous Administration requested that funding for a range of discretionary programs, including the Drug Court program and the Mentally Ill Offender Crime Treatment Reduction Act Program, be consolidated into a new Byrne Public Safety and Protection Program for funding purposes; Congress chose to instead continue funding each individually. This consolidation proposal **was not** included in the FY 09 Omnibus Bill.*
