What is covered?

- **TOPIC 1: Shifting to Care Management** — Assess the key components of the shift to care management approach.

- **TOPIC 3: Change Strategies** — Identify three types of change and why each requires different strategies.
- **TOPIC 4: Apply a Model of Change** — Apply model of change management to identified organization changes.
- **TOPIC 5: Workshop Model of Change Approach** — Workshop the approach to applying model of change and develop concrete change plans.
- **TOPIC 6: Data-informed Care** — Why being data informed is critical in a care-management approach and how teams can use data in their care.
- **TOPIC 7: Communications Planning** — Develop a communications plan.
- **TOPIC 8: Implementing Change** — How to implement functions of supervision, optimize supervision and use the right intervention for the right problem.
- **TOPIC 9: Supporting Change** — How to use huddles, team meetings and case conferences to support change.
