



## Certificate Program in Integrated Primary Care

The Certificate Program in Integrated Primary Care is a continuing education program intended to prepare healthcare professionals interested in preparing for the integrated primary care environment of the future. The distance-based format uses a combination of video lectures, online discussion, and readings. The format allows participants the flexibility they need to integrate program demands into their busy schedules.

The curriculum was developed under the guidance of Neftali Serrano, Psy.D., and Hunter Hansen, Psy.D., who are nationally recognized as trainers of healthcare professionals interested in working in integrated primary care settings.

The program emphasizes both pedagogy and the development of clinical skills. The latter is provided through weekly discussion boards focusing on clinical problem-solving and activities.

The program consists of five units, each comprised of four modules, completed over 20 weeks. Participants are awarded 80 continuing education or continuing medical education credits and a certificate of completion.
