

Benefits of Team-Base Care

- Improved safety, reduced errors, better communication and better clinical outcomes including reduced hypertension, diabetes, and emergency department (ED) utilization. (Smith, 2018; Dehmer, 2016; AHRQ publication, 2015)
- **Greater capacity and overall access** to care and reduced complications. (Weller, 2014)
- **Reduced hospital admissions**, 30-day all-cause readmissions, length of stay, mortality rates, and total costs. (WHO, 2010; English, 2017)
- Improved experiences for people receiving services and providers, including enhanced acceptance of treatment, decreased staff turnover, and decreased tension and conflict among care providers.
- Decreased burnout and increased staff productivity. (Smith, 2018)





Team-Based Care (TBC)

Fundamental Definition

- At least two health providers who work collaboratively with patients and their caregivers—to the extent preferred by patient—to accomplish shared goals and achieve coordinated, high quality care.¹
- Inter-disciplinary (e.g., behavioral health professionals, primary care professionals, peer support specialists).¹
- Clear roles, mutual trust, effective communication, measurable processes and outcomes.²

High-Functioning Team-Based Care

Based on our review of the literature and examples from the field, the following components are necessary to implement and sustain a high-functioning team-based care approach:

- 1. Leadership support and a dedicated implementation team.
- 2. High-functioning, collaborative teams.
- 3. Measurement-based care pathways and protocols.
- 4. Person-served engagement strategies and activities.
- 5. Ongoing training and communication.

What It Offers

High-functioning, team-based care offers a number of advantages to CBHCs functioning in the value-based payment environment, such as CCBHCs, including:

- Increased mental health care access
- Improved population health outcomes
- Increased engagement and satisfaction
- Reduced staff burnout
- Standardized care pathways
- Improved integration.
- Increased organizational capacity


