







Purpose

This Trauma-Informed Primary Care: Fostering Resilience and Recovery Training Plan establishes procedures to plan, develop, implement, and maintain the training program and curriculum. The following objectives have been established for this plan:

- Educate all staff on trauma, its prevalence and impacts
- Provide all staff with tools and strategies for implementing a trauma-informed approach into their daily work
- · Connect trauma and health outcomes for all staff

Requirement & Prerequisites

The general trainings identified in this plan should be required for all staff within the primary care practice, including, but not limited to, billing staff, front desk staff, facilities staff, clinical staff and leadership. The intermediate trainings identified are specific to clinical staff and leadership and should be provided after all general training sessions have been completed.

Strategy & Approach

The trainings developed by the National Council (see Section 5) are available for primary care sites to use with their staff. Trainings can be provided at one time or broken down into different mini-trainings. Information from the trainings can also be provided in virtual format, i.e. webinars. If the trainings developed by the National Council are not used, the topics in Section 5 should be covered in the trainings for staff.

Training Topics

For training to be effective, all staff should receive general training in the foundations of the following:

- Trauma-informed care vs. trauma-specific treatment
- Treating trauma vs. healing trauma
- Relevant research on the role of developmental trauma as causes for poor health outcomes
- Trauma in the context of culture
- Simple interventions for treating shock, trauma and stress states
- The long-term impact of trauma and loss on physical and mental health
- The correlation between trauma and addictions
- · Self-care skills for all staff

Once all staff have been trained in the training topics above, all clinical staff should be trained in all new clinical pathways and workflows. Additional topics for consideration include:

- Identifying and assessing individuals who have experienced trauma
- Practice-based trauma interventions
- Trauma-informed examination



- Engaging families and support networks
- The role of the therapeutic relationship in healing traumas
- A mind/body/spirit approach to healing trauma
- · Helping patients learn emotional self-regulation skills
- Preparing patients to cope effectively with future challenges

All staff responsible for supervision should also receive training on Trauma-Informed Supervision.
