

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



Variety Care

Community Health Center (designated as an FQHC with CMS)

- Health Centers in 3 Urban areas and 3 Rural Counties for a total of 21 with 5 underdevelopment
- Employs and contracts over 200 licensed providers and a total of 750 employees
- Medical (FM, Peds, IM, ID, Geriatrics, OB/Gyn, Urgent Care, X-ray/Ultrasound Mammography and MFM (2024))
- Integrated Behavioral Health Care including Psychiatry & MAT
- Dental (full service including restorative crown, bridge and orthodontics)
- Optometry
- Diverse Populations, MSFW, LGBT, Adolescent Heath, Geriatrics, SMI
- 2022 served 197,000 Oklahomans including 78,851 clinical patients
- We started in Show Business in 1932





NorthCare

CCBHC Medicaid Demonstration Pilot – began April 2016

- NorthCare serves around 9800 mental health and addiction consumers in Oklahoma.
- It provides Child Welfare services in 45 of the state of Oklahoma's 77 counties.
- The agency has a large proportion of homeless consumers (approximately 33%). It also has a large number of individuals in the criminal justice system.
- Partnered with Variety Care in 2008 to provide integrated primary and behavioral healthcare services in Oklahoma City & received funding from SAMHSA in 2009; in 2016, moved into new outpatient services building co-located with Variety Care






Mental Health Partners

CCBHC Expansion Grantee, 2018-2022

- Target pop's: All ages, mental illness and substance use disorders
- Over 10,000 clients served annually in clinical settings and 20,000 reached via trainings, outreach, and community-based programs
- With CCBHC-E funding, implemented Community Health Worker program, Anxiety Intensive Outpatient program, and Substance Use Disorders Intensive Outpatient Program








Clinica Family Health

FQHC


- Target pop's: All ages, under 200% of Federal Poverty Level, primary care, oral health and integrated behavioral health.
- Over 57,000 patients served annually at 6 community-based clinics
- Patient-Centered Medical Home with core values of team-based care
- Services including primary care, dental services, prenatal/maternal care, pediatric care, nutrition services, pharmacy, behavioral health.


