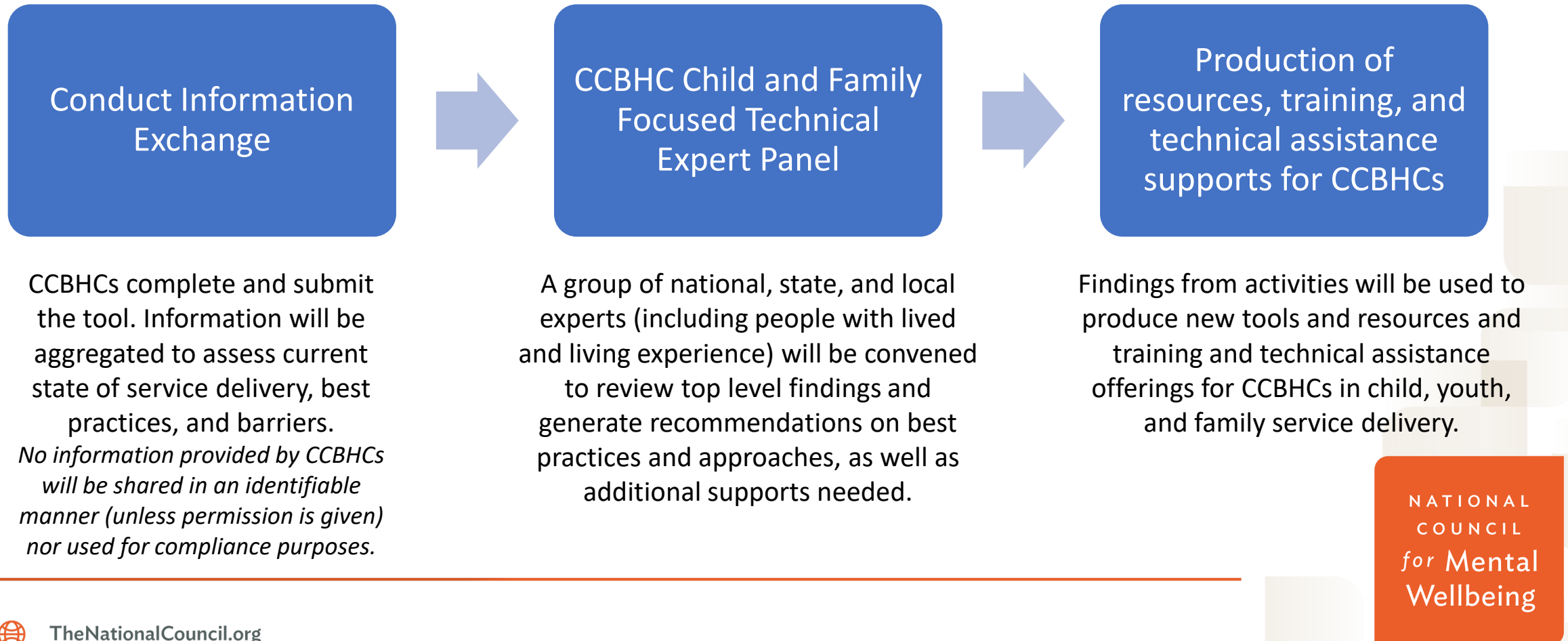

Background and Context

- CCBHCs play a critical role in enhancing service access and expanding service types to meet the needs of children and youth with behavioral health needs and their families. However, there is limited information nationally on what range of services are being provided, what best practice and innovation approaches are being employed, and what types of implementation challenges are impacting the delivery of these services.
- The information exchange is intended as one mechanism of generating greater insight into current practices, challenges, and needs of CCBHCs in providing child, youth, and family services. Insights will be used to:
 - Generate recommendations and supports for the field on best and promising practices for CCBHCs.
 - Establish new training and technical assistance offerings for grantees focused on child and family services.

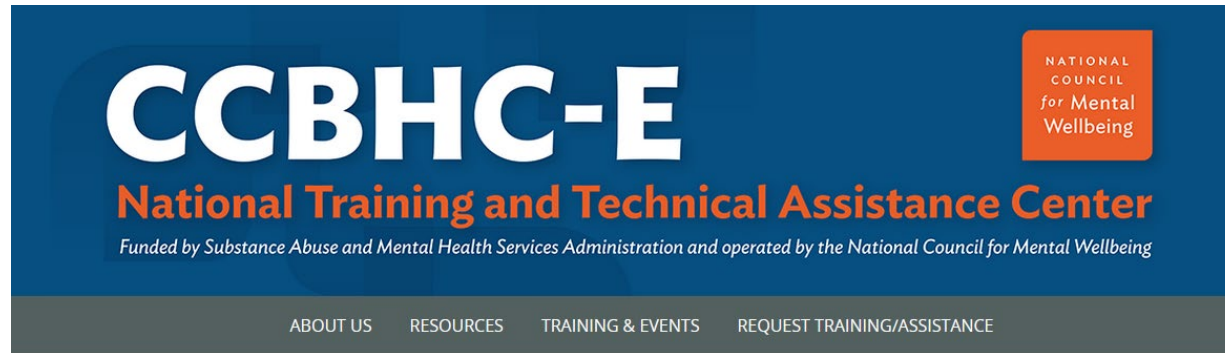
