Background and Context

- CCBHCs play a critical role in enhancing service access and expanding service types to meet the needs
 of children and youth with behavioral health needs and their families. However, there is limited
 information nationally on what range of services are being provided, what best practice and innovation
 approaches are being employed, and what types of implementation challenges are impacting the
 delivery of these services.
- The information exchange is intended as one mechanism of generating greater insight into current practices, challenges, and needs of CCBHCs in providing child, youth, and family services. Insights will be used to:
 - Generate recommendations and supports for the field on best and promising practices for CCBHCs.
 - Establish new training and technical assistance offerings for grantees focused on child and family services.

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What will be done with this information?

Conduct Information Exchange



CCBHCs complete and submit the tool. Information will be aggregated to assess current state of service delivery, best practices, and barriers. No information provided by CCBHCs will be shared in an identifiable manner (unless permission is given) nor used for compliance purposes. CCBHC Child and Family Focused Technical Expert Panel

A group of national, state, and local experts (including people with lived and living experience) will be convened to review top level findings and generate recommendations on best practices and approaches, as well as additional supports needed.



Findings from activities will be used to produce new tools and resources and training and technical assistance offerings for CCBHCs in child, youth, and family service delivery.


